REFLECTION:

Stroke is the second leading cause of death and disability and affects thousands of Australians each year. About 35,000 people each year are admitted to hospital with a stroke, equating to one stroke every 15 minutes. Over 375,000 Australians have had a stroke at some time in their lives, with a third sustaining a disability because of their stroke.

Despite well-established guidelines, not all people with stroke receive appropriate treatment and there is variation in the type of care received. There is also evidence that the impact of stroke is greater in some communities than in others. The standard by The Australian Commission on Safety and Quality in Health Care is the basis for this session.
