REFLECTION:

The Australian Immunisation Handbook 10th Edition provides good information on vaccine-preventable communicable diseases.

Typhoid fever is a clinical syndrome caused by systemic infection with *Salmonella enterica* subspecies *enterica* serovar Typhi (*S. Typhi*). Paratyphoid fever, caused by infection with *S. enterica* serovar Paratyphi A or B, is similar to, and often indistinguishable from, typhoid fever. The two infections are collectively known as enteric fever, have largely overlapping geographic distributions, and, although there is no vaccine specifically targeted against paratyphoid fever, there is evidence to suggest some cross-protection from the oral live attenuated typhoid vaccine against Paratyphi B.
